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Govt. Degree College, Nirmand: An Overview

Govt. Degree College, Nirmand, is a co-educational institution established in the year 2016 to empower the young minds of one of the largest villages in Himachal Pradesh—Nirmand, through a culture of academic rigor, creativity and discipline. Since its inception vide notification No. EDN-A-KA(1)4/2012, dated 16th May 2016, of the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh, the institution has been functioning in the building of Govt. Primary School (Nirmand) and it offers two undergraduate programmes—Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Commerce. With its humble beginning, with strength of 40 students, the college today stands committed to foster a spirit of academic excellence and holistic growth among 182 students of the college. The dedicated teachers of the college adopt a personalized approach to engage with students to guide them on the path of critical thinking and effective communication.

The college primarily caters to the rural areas of Nirmand and is committed to making educational opportunities accessible to students across the socio-economic spectrum of the area with a commitment towards inclusivity. Nirmand, famously known as the Kashi of Himalayas, is located in district Kullu of Himachal Pradesh. This beautiful hamlet stands overlooking the Sutlej Valley and is about 163 km from Kullu district headquarter, 150 km from Shimla. The present campus of the college presents a majestic view of the mountains with thick forest and an azure sky. Within the campus, the students are welcomed by beautifully managed flower beds and fresh air. With such closeness to nature, the college offers an encouraging environment for the students to explore new ideas, critically engage with them and practically take them to the space outside the institution. In addition to the academics, students also get an opportunity to enrich their holistic personalities by embracing and revering the local cultural traditions of the area.

To make campus life dynamic for the students, the college has smart classrooms with Wi-Fi facility, a library, a canteen and a ground for sports activities. The students get an opportunity to engage in community work by joining NCC, NSS and clubs like Red Ribbon Club, Eco Club and Road Safety Club. The creative impulse of the students also gets a platform through the Ekatva Literary Society. The Economics and Commerce Association has been formed in the college to provide a platform to deepen their understanding through academic activities, networking opportunities with industry professionals and enhancing their career prospects in the field of Economics and Commerce. Various activities are organized by these clubs, societies and units that provide students opportunities of wider interaction, leadership, group work and thinking outside the box. The college also has different committees which are dedicated to various aspects of administration, academics and holistic wellbeing of the students.

To provide advance infrastructure and facilities to the students of the area, that is, 26 Panchayats, the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh has transferred 33.86 *bhiga* of land to the Department of Higher Education for constructing the new campus of the college. The construction work is expected to begin in the new financial year.

Annual Internal Ranking (2024-25) of Govt. Colleges of Himachal Pradesh on the Basis of Self Assessment Report (2023-24)

The Directorate of Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh, via notification No. EDN- H(8) (1) Misc-Ranking of colleges, dated 20th August, 2024, directed all the Govt. Degree and Sanskrit colleges of the state to prepare Self Assessment Report (2023-24) for the purpose of the Annual Internal Ranking (2024-25). The primary objective of this initiative is to foster healthy competition among colleges, encourage creativity and critical thinking among students, and ensure proper documentation of various academic and extracurricular activities. The ranking system aims to promote continuous improvement in quality parameters, facilitate NAAC accreditation, and enhance student enrolment in rural colleges through quality initiative. The colleges have been categorized into three tiers based on student strength and the number of streams offered:

Tier 1 Colleges: Colleges with more than 1000 students offering all streams (Arts, Science, Commerce). Sanskrit colleges with over 1000 students also fall under this category.

Tier 2 Colleges: Colleges with less than 1000 students offering all streams. Sanskrit colleges with 501-1000 students are included here.

Tier 3 Colleges: Newer colleges offering only one or two streams. Sanskrit colleges with up to 500 students are categorized here.

All the colleges will be ranked at two levels-- Overall Ranking and Tier-wise Ranking, under this initiative.

Govt. Degree College successfully submitted its SAR 2023-24 as per the timeline given by the DHE, Himachal Pradesh. Haris (Member), visited the college for the physical verification of SAR on 20th November, 2024. The college was judged under the following criteria for ranking:

College Library:

College library plays a pivotal role in an educational institution as it plays the role of a hub for learning, research and academic support. The library of Govt. Degree College- Nirmand has around 595 books for the benefit of its students and staff with a seating capacity of 50 persons. The library has around 55 books related to the preparation of competitive examinations. There are also a significant number of reference books that can help students with deeper understanding of different disciplines. The students are also provided three daily newspapers for reading— *Indian Express*, *The Tribune* and *Amar Ujala*. 
